Course Description

Throughout the school year, students will be introduced to the Georgia Standards of Excellence (GSE) curriculum. The main implementation tool used for instruction will be the *McGraw-Hill StudySync*, English Language Arts Grade 6 textbook. The newly adopted program is a complete ELA curriculum designed to meet the rigorous academic needs of today's classroom. In print or online, *StudySync* is designed to engage every student and offers the most diverse and culturally responsive texts to ensure students are able to see themselves in the literature they are reading, as well as learning about others. This textbook is also aligned with the GSE and is inclusive of the necessary performance elements needed for student mastery. Each day, students will be exposed to a rigorous curriculum in which they will work towards gaining an enduring understanding through skills and strategies that address their individual learning modalities. Activities within the curriculum include close reading of texts, oral interpretations, collaborative discussions and assignments, and written analyses.

Academic honesty – Receiving or giving information for an assignment is cheating and when caught in the act students will not receive credit nor receive the opportunity for a chance of make-up. Plagiarism is not acceptable: If a student takes information from the Internet or any printed resources without a citation or copies directly from a source, it is considered plagiarism and the assignment will not be accepted.

Make-up work – Announced work, such as homework, quizzes and major assessments are due the day the student returns. For each day's excused absence, students will have one day to make up missed work. If a student is absent under extenuating circumstances, special arrangements can be made to make up work. Please refer to the student handbook for further information about excused and unexcused absences. IT IS THE STUDENT'S RESPONSIBILITY TO CHECK THE CALENDAR AND/OR REQUEST MISSED WORK.
