CLUBS

If, in the future a club is added, you will be sent information on the club and will be required to complete a form giving your permission for your student's participation in the new club.

Name of Club: AFTER SCHOOL ART CLUB

The After School Art Club is a fun filled and educational program intended to give students a safe atmosphere in which to learn and practice within the creative arts.

Each week an artist or artistic style will be the inspiration for a different art activity. Art history and criticism will be included, as well as art vocabulary. The weekly themes will focus on a variety of countries, cultures, and at times a time period, or artistic style. These themes will be the basis for an arts centered lesson plan for each day of the week that focuses on imagination, poetry, music, or visual art activities.

The art lessons will provide students with the opportunity to expand their horizons and hone their creative skills. The goal is to produce pupils who are more capable of deep, reflective thought and more prepared for success in the real world. **Lesson include:**
